REMEMBERANCE

As we remember and reflect on the horrific events of 9/11 on the tenth anniversary of the attack, let us pay tribute and homage to **STEVEN E. FURMAN** (1960 -2001) (*Chonon*

Berman/Bailia Levitz/Bessie Barkan/Joyce Furman) who lost his life in the unforgivable act of terrorism on the World Trade Center.

In tribute to Steve we reprint here a profile "selected from the hundreds that have appeared in newspapers across the country" selected by and printed under the caption "Gone, But Not Forgotten in the October/November 2001 issue of Futures Industry, the leading industry magazine:

Steven Furman followed his family to the trading floor. His brother Andrew is a COMEX Division member and was a NYMEX Division member for 15 years. Another brother, Michael, formerly traded silver on COMES and potatoes and later crude oil on the Exchanger. His sister Jayne worked as a clerk on the floor; and his stepfather, Harold Lilies is an equity owner and was one of the first individuals to actively trade for his own account on NYMEX ACCESS.

Furman, of Wesley Hills, New York, traded options. He joined the exchange in 1988, became a COMEX Division member in 1998, and served on the arbitration, adjudication, settlement, and floor committees. He left the exchange last April (1991) to take a job with Cantor Fitzgerald on the 105th floor of One World Trade Center trading natural gas and electricity.

"He was an exceptionally fine person," said Harvey Gralia, "he always tried to help."

FurmaN, 40, HAD A HIGHLY MATHEMATICAL MIND. His parents are world class bridge players, his brother Andrew said, and once on a motor trip to Missouri, Furman, who was 12 or 13 years old, pestered Lilie to teach him the game. "Our stepfather gave him a book on bridge, about 300 pages, which he read in the car. By the time they got to Missouri, Steven said "I am ready to play."

"Harold was flabbergasted," Andrew Furman said, and gave him a verbal test. Steven aced the test and got to play with Harold as his partner."

Furman held a degree in applied mathematics from the State University of New York at Stony Brook.

He is also survived by his wife, Chavi, and four children, Nathan, 11; Rachel, 10; Naomi, 8; and Menashe, 5.

The following are some insightful quotes from the September 17, 2001 issue of the Las Vegas Review-Journal in an article headlined, *Shock hits Las Vegas family hard*:

"Having scored a 790 out of a possible 800 on the math portion of the SAT, the siblings said Steven was a perfectionist with a highly mathematical mind, but a selfless hart."

"He was an honest man, refusing even to tell the occasional white lie."

"Jayne said he often missed sleep helping friends and family whenever they needed it. She said he was th kind of guy who would drive 60 miles outside the city to help someone he knew to install an air conditioner. 'He was driven by doing good deeds, helping others and raising his family.'"

BELARUS

(Because of the substantial interest engendered by the earlier publication of excerpts from the second of a series of presentations by Rochelle Goldberg Ruthchild, a research associate at the Davis Center for Russian and Eurasian Studies at Harvard University, to the Jewish Genealogical Society of Greater Boston entitled "Jewish History of Belarus", we are serializing the Program Report of the first lecture that appeared in the March 2001 (Volume XX, Number 1, Issue 67) issue of Mass-Pocha, the publication of the JGSGB. This is the second installment of that article.)

Economic and Social Structure

In 1852 Russia forced Jews living in other areas to resettle in the Pale and imposed educational and landowning restrictions. Many could work only as artisans and shopkeepers (and eventually factory workers). Quotas and pogroms followed. As the qyality of life deteriorated, revolutionary movements arose, particularly in cities, where Jews were concentrated.

Despite economic restrictions to the Pale, the Jewish population exploded from one million in 1800 to five million in 1900, not counting the three million who emigrated. Population pressure and barriers to landownership caused great poverty. The reactionary and anti-Demetic advisors to Czar Alexander III famously suggested to him that a third of the Jews should leave, a third starve, and the rest convert.

In Belarusian villages today, reminders of Jewish settlement can still be seen in the architecture of the houses. Jews were not allowed to own land, so they often became tradesman. Since they often conducted their trades from their homes, their houses had a front door near the street that led to a room for these activities, still detectable today in those formerly Jewish homes that have been modified to have the more usual side or rear entrance from the garden.

In Jewish homes, women were often the breadwinners of the family, while the men engaged in religious study. In addition to inn-keeping and liquor dealing, some engaged in prostitution. Scholem Asch's popularplay, *God of Vengeance*, was about s brothel keeper and his wife, a former prostitute. The silent movie *The Yellow Ticket* illustrated how girls, as supposed prostitutes, could get permits called "yellow tickets" that allowed them to travel to the big Russian cities. Some used this as a device to become university students.
